A Message from our Executive Director:



Summertime is always a busy season for us here at Renfrew.

Just like the families who called this property home generations before us, we're tied to the land. Our staff and volunteers carry forth the tradition in a long line of caretakers who worked and toiled, lived and loved on this farm. From its earliest development by settlers like the Stoners and Renfrews in Pennsylvania's colonial period to the century-long residency of the Royers and Fahnestocks, the ownership of Dr. Strickler and his tenants the Minnichs and Beavers, to the loving restoration by our last private owners Edgar and Emma Nicodemus, Renfrew Museum and Park enjoys a rich farming heritage spanning nearly 300 years.

In this issue, we'll explore some of the stories of Renfrew's more recent residents through the artifacts they left behind. We'll meet John H. Minnich (page 2) who lived and worked on the farm in the early twentieth century, then throw it back to the Swingin' Sixties to recall *Emma's "Flair" for Hospitality* (pages 3 & 4). Even more unique objects from our farming past will be featured in our upcoming "Treasures from the Collection" Members-Only Event coming up on October 7th (learn more on page 9).

Discover the seasonal rhythm of life on the farm at Renfrew's next signature event, Farmstead Day (pages 5 & 6), coming up on Saturday, August 7, 2021. This annual program has been expanded to include a full day of family-friendly activities, living history interpretation, horse-drawn wagon rides, tours, and more! This summer, Renfrew received a wonderful gift from member Thomas Minnich, descendent of former residents of the farm. The donation included a collection of tools (pictured at left) owned and used by his ancestor, John H. Minnich, while in residence at what would ultimately become Renfrew.

John H. Minnich was born on May 23, 1855 in Chewsville, Washington County, Maryland to Joseph Minnich, a carpenter, and his wife Catharine Springer; the eldest of their six children. As a young man, he worked as a farm laborer and carpenter, learning the trade from his father. He married Annie L. Kriner (1855-1922) in 1878 and the couple had three children together: Pearl (b.1884), Suddie (b.1887), and John W. (b.1891). By 1900, at age 45, his occupation is listed as carpenter with Minnich owning his home with a mortgage in Washington Township, Franklin County. A decade later he is

listed as farmer employed by himself, renting his home—the historic stone Royer House. By 1914, records indicate that his son, John W. Minnich, had joined him on the Renfrew property. John W. and his wife Earla, had five of their eight children here.

On September 10, 1922, Annie passed away from tuberculosis and John H. Minnich, now a widower, continued to work the farm along side his son, daughter-in-law, and grandchildren. The Minnich family moved away from the farm in 1933, when residency was then assumed by Clarence and Elizabeth Beaver. The Minnichs remained in Washington Township, continuing to farm. John H. Minnich died at age 82 on December 26, 1937. At the time of his death he was employed on the Leshner Farm with his death certificate indicating he had been a farmer for the last seventy-five years. His is buried beside his wife in Green Hill Cemetery in Waynesboro.

Emma's "Flair" for hospitality!

Renfrew Museum and Park's founder, Emma Nicodemus, enjoyed entertaining and having friends and acquaintances over as house guests. Whether it was holding bridge parties with her girlfriends in the lower level of the Smoke House adjacent to the main residence, or baking holiday cookies, cakes, and pies for friends and neighbors, Emma was the quintessential mid-century "hostess with the most-ess"! This flair for hospitality was made a bit easier with the use of Emma's Frigidaire Flair Custom Imperial Electric Range. In the 1960's Frigidaire was a division of General Motors Corporation out of Dayton, Ohio. Touting their modern line of electric ranges, Frigidaire noted, "You won't need a 'post graduate' course in cooking! Keep right on using all your favorite recipes as well as the new ones you're bound to try."

"You'll like cooking with your new Frigidaire Electric Range because it's so clean, so cool, so easy and so accurate." - Owner's Manual

Emma's state-of-the-art range was installed in her modern kitchen on the south end of the historic Royer kitchen in Renfrew's Museum House. Sometime in the early twentieth century, the original open cook hearth had been closed up and a partition wall built down the center of the space to create two rooms. After Edgar and Emma's renovation in the 1940's, the northern room off the porch was used as an informal foyer and breakfast nook with the kitchen area to the south outfitted with crisp white cabinets and laminate countertops. A butcherblock-topped peninsula and suite of brand new Frigidaire appliances including range, refrigerator, and dishwasher completed the look of her gleaming, modern kitchen.

Special features of the Frigidaire Flair range included an adjustable pull-out four Radiantube surface cooktop, electric time signal, built-in clock, and duel ovens with swing up doors to "get maximum clearance for tall utensils on the surface units."

FUN FACT: The Frigidaire Flair range was featured in Samantha Stevens' kitchen on the hit 1960's sit-com *Bewitched*.
