OCTOBER 1 through DECEMBER 20 NEW EXHIBIT "BLANKET CHESTS IN THE PENNSYLVANIA-GERMAN STYLE" the final exhibit of the 1981 season is one you won't want to miss. The display is drawn from chests loaned by private individuals, as well as, a few never before exhibited from the Nicodemus Collection. 10 chests, all made between 1775 and 1820, including 3 walnut and 7 painted types, will be on view. Of particular note is an extremely rare sulfur inlay walnut chest made in Lancaster Pa. and dated 1775. The featured chest in the exhibit is on loan and was painted by the well known Christian Selzer who worked in Jonestown, Pa. Also included is a rare Franklin Co., Pa. chest.

This is an excellent opportunity to study many different blanket chests, particularly ones never before on public display and in private collections.

Sunday November 8, 2 p.m. VIRGINIA McLAUGHLIN will present a slide illustrated lecture and demonstration on "EARLY AMERICAN TRAVELING ARTISTS AND THEIR SKILLS IN STENCILING, GRAINING, MARBELIZING, AND 'FANCY PAINTING' IN HOMES AND ON FURNITURE" Mrs. McLaughlin is a well known professional Commercial Artist from Fairfield, Pa. She has worked for Interior Decorators in Georgetown and other Washington D. C. firms painting murals and also stenciling and graining interiors. Some of her lovely stencil work can be seen at the famous Fairfield Inn on Main Street in Fairfield, Pa. Mrs. McLaughlin has carefully researched the history of 'fancy painters' and their art in order to draw her own designs from accurate historical patterns and examples. Her slides show furniture and interiors from across the United States. She will also answer questions and give advice

to those of you who are interested in learning this art.

Sunday November 15, 2 p.m. DR. H. E. COMSTOCK of Winchester, Va. will speak on "SHENANDOAH POTTERY" featuring the BELL FAMILY POTTERS of Waynesboro, Pa. and Strasburg, Va. Dr. Comstock is one of the leading experts in the field of Shenandoah pottery and is well known for his collaboration on the book Folk Pottery of the Shenandoah Valley. He has one of the finest and largest private collections of Bell pottery and has spent many years researching the history of the Bell family and their competitors. You won't want to miss this rare opportunity to hear this esteemed scholar.
