GUIDELINES FOR 13TH NORTH CAROLINA

All items should be of good quality and standards should be of the utmost authenticity

Headwear:

CS Issue or Civilian style hats preferred

NC caps like the Amzi Williamson preferred as well

Plain CS caps acceptable

Jackets:

North Carolina Jacket made of Jean wool preferred (the Ogburn and Williamson style coats highly encouraged!)

Richmond Depot Type II made of Jean wool also acceptable

Shirts:

CS Issue shirts preferred

Civilian shirts acceptable

Pants:

NC Issue Trousers made of Jean wool preferred

Richmond Style trousers made of Jean wool preferred

Civilian trousers acceptable

Drawers:

CS Issue

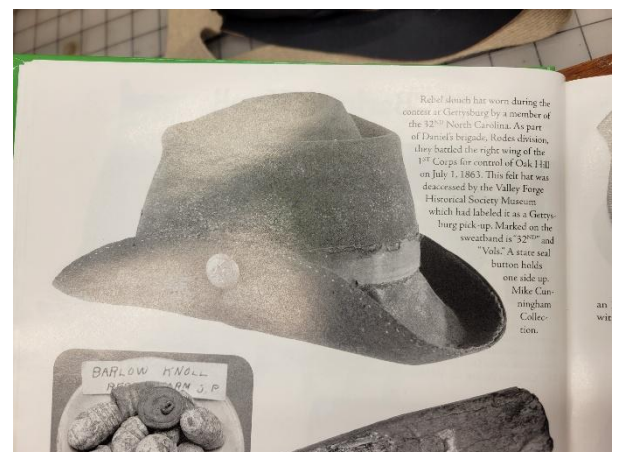
Civilian

Footwear:

Woolen or cotton socks made correctly preferred

Shoes: CS Issue, Civilian, and English Import preferred

Boots acceptable



Cartridge Box:

CS Issue from Richmond or NC provenance preferred

Cap Pouch:

CS Issue from Richmond or NC provenance preferred

Bayonet Scabbard:

CS Issue from Richmond or NC provenance preferred

Belt:

CS Issue from Richmond or NC provenance preferred (Roller buckle belts and frame buckles preferred)

Haversack:

Based on an original example (Goulding, Alexander, etc.)

US haversacks acceptable

Canteen:

Tin Drum Canteens, Gardner wooden canteens and US 1858 style Canteens acceptable

Blankets:

CS Issue blankets, Civilian, and US Issue preferred

Ground cloths:

CS Painted ground cloths and Rubberized Ground cloths preferred

Knapsacks:

Kibler style bags, Double bags, S. Isaac & Campbell's, blanket rolls preferred

Arms:

1853 Enfields, 1861 Springfield's, preferred, 1842s acceptable as well.

All in all, a pretty generic 1863 North Carolina impression.
